Our Vision:

The vision of the Domestic Violence Center of Chester County is to eliminate domestic violence in Chester County.

Our Mission:

The mission of the Domestic Violence Center of Chester County is to provide intervention, education, outreach, advocacy and programs to prevent, reduce and remedy domestic violence in Chester County.

Our Philosophy:

We believe that all people and children are entitled to a safe environment free from violence. We recognize that every person is at risk, and we are committed to working collectively and cooperatively to end violence against women, men, and their children in our community.

We believe that each person has the ability and right to control their own life. We are committed to empowerment-based support services which affirm a person's competence to make decisions.

We believe we must take an active role in increasing public awareness that domestic violence is a crime and in advocating

Our History:

Founded in 1976, DVCCC is the only organization in Chester County providing services exclusively for victims of domestic violence and their children and is the sole agency under contract from the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services to do so. DVCCC began as the YWCA Women's Resource Center (WRC), to serve as an information and referral service for Chester County women. Once this service became known, it started receiving a flood of calls from women in situations of domestic violence. The directors of WRC, finding no organization in the area to which the victims could be referred, reorganized the organization as the Domestic Violence Center of Chester County, focusing on domestic violence intervention and prevention.

Our Services:

DVCCC provides services to victims of domestic abuse and their dependent children throughout Chester County. We offer services at our main site and at our four outreach centers in Kennett Square, Oxford, Coatesville and Phoenixville. Our main building, located at a confidential address to assure client safety and privacy, is accessible 24 hours a day to serve victims and residents. Our outreach centers do not offer shelter facilities and their addresses are published. All services are free and confidential. Services include:

Dear Friends and Partners,

Our survivors have shown us to "walk the walk" from an entirely different perspective.

Last summer, our young (and not so young) participants headed out to the sidewalk with a bucket of colored chalk. Without any instruction, they drew flowers, suns, rainbows: all depictions of happiness and inspiration. When it rained, they'd go back out and draw something different the next day.



On the third day, one of these young artists began calling it the Walk of Life.

To us, these images have become much more than sidewalk drawings. These inspirational messages are a revolving testament to the strength and resilience that constantly surrounds us, from our generous donors, volunteers, our community partners, the police and justice communities, but also from the survivors we serve.

Together, it takes all of us to walk the Walk of Life.



And life, more than anything else, is precious. We have learned that when domestic violence goes undocumented and unmarked, we all suffer. This was true in our own community as in Sutherland Springs and Northern California. While many victims continue to fight for safety for themselves and for their children, we can't ignore the reality that domestic abuse impacts every one of us. This drives us to answer every phone call, to battle for each Protection from Abuse order, to heed every request for emergency shelter.

This year, we're empowered and vigilant that there is no end to the work we have ahead of us. Our programs address awareness along with protection, informing teens along with the elderly, in reinforcing healthy relationships with young men along with young women. The work we do is impacted by the ever-changing needs of our community, so that every new influence on abuse is being confronted.

This sidewalk ahead of us, with its color and its inspiration, leads to every other in Chester County. We are prepared to walk every block until our message is clear, participants are empowered, and the survivors suffering in silence know that they are not alone.

From Suzanne: "I would like to say how much DVCCC has helped me. It was a savior one night when I was at my wits end with the abusive relationship I was dealing with. I called the shelter, hearing a woman's voice I have heard before. She remembered exactly who I was and said, 'We have tried to contact you before but your phone was disconnected. We have been waiting for you to call.' I was relieved to hear that. That night I couldn't believe how much the place looked like a home. They accommodated me and my children so comfortably. They helped me so much. I am currently enrolled in continued housing with DVCCC. This experience has truly helped me and my children, and I couldn't have asked for a better opportunity to change my life around."



From Maria: "This program supported me in walking away from a very toxic relationship, while it continuously inspired me to walk TOWARD myself. Prior to moving to phase 4 housing, I felt broken. I had low self-worth, depression, and a general feeling of being lost in the world. Now, I feel empowered. I'm living a purpose driven life. I am full of light, love, and strength. I am a better help to others. I started to love others in a healthier way once I learned to love myself. I have healthy boundaries now. This helps in so many ways with all of my relationship, but particularly with raising my children. Living here helped me to get out of some of my debt. My credit score is much better. I feel like a confident woman who is on a path with limitless potential. Thank you so much to everyone involved with DVCCC. I'm forever grateful for this transformation. Who knows where I would be if I hadn't accepted the help that I so badly needed!!! You are all guardian angels! God bless you!"


Our Accomplishments


The direct services provided by DVCCC include our 24 hour crisis hotline, emergency safe house/shelter, adult and children's trauma-informed counseling, children's services, housing programs, legal representation and advocacy and community outreach. Services are provided at our main confidential location, and at outreach offices in Coatesville, Kennett Square, Oxford and Phoenixville.

2016-2017 Estimates and Outcomes

Every year we plan for the upcoming fiscal year in part by creating estimates for services to be provided and victims to be served.

- We estimated we would serve 1,700 adult victims, along with 150 of their children. At the end of the year, we served 3,124 new and continuing adult victims and 261 children
- We estimated we would provide 1,368 days of shelter to adults and 2,732 days of shelter to children. At the end of the year, we provided 1,919 days of shelter to adults and 2,471 days of shelter to children.
- We estimated we would provide 10,000 hours of counseling and advocacy to adult victims and 600 hours to children. At the end of the year, we provided 10,105 hours of counseling and advocacy to adults and 956 to children.





In addition:

- ◆ 71 victims and their dependent children were provided with Emergency Shelter.
- ♦ 26 families were provided with transitional housing
- ♦ 875 participants were provided with legal options counseling.
- 256 participants received representation in protection from abuse orders.
- ♦ 3,491 hotline calls were answered.
- ♦ Volunteers provided over 2,600 hours of service.
- ♦ 132 community education programs were provided to groups reaching approximately 12,700 persons. This included 63 presentations to schools and youth groups about dating violence awareness.

<u>Pictured at right:</u> The West Chester Bayard Rustin High School Boys Track and Field Team partnered with DVCCC this spring to bring the Coaching Boys Into Men (CBIM) program to Rustin High School. Rustin Head Coach Shaz Brown and DVCCC's Amelia Rayburn spearheaded the effort, which is aimed at promoting and teaching respectful behavior and prevention of relationship abuse, harassment, and sexual assault. Coach Brown and the track team volunteered to be the first Rustin team to partner with the DVCCC and incorporate the CBIM program into their interscholastic competition season.




Our Accomplishments

Lethality Assessment Program (LAP)

The LAP is collaboration between the District Attorney's office, law enforcement and the Domestic Violence Center. A police officer responding to the scene of a domestic violence incident uses a brief eleven question risk assessment called the Lethality Screen to identify victims at high risk of homicide. Victims of intimate partner violence that screen in as "high risk" based on the Lethality Screen are put in immediate telephone contact with DVCCC who provides the victim with advocacy and safety planning.

Thirty-six of forty-two Chester County municipal police departments are trained in implementing the evidenced based LAP. Quarterly each police department Chief and our District Attorney receives a LAP progress report developed by DVCCC.




